

I currently serve as Associate Director for Graduate and International Admissions for Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology. I am responsible for all international student recruitment and annual enrollment including all marketing, budget, and travel activities. I have been a member of the International Association for College Admission Counseling Finance Committee since July 1, 2016 having served on the Exhibitors Sub-committee and as Sponsors Sub-committee Chair.

I have been a member of NACAC since 2003 attending my first NACAC Conference in Austin, TX in 2007. I have recruited internationally since 2010 following the Rose-Hulman philosophy that working directly with students and their counselors is best for the student. As such, relationships with colleagues at high schools and colleges around the world are of paramount importance. I finally found and joined International ACAC (then OACAC) in 2014. I have attended conferences at University of South Florida (2014), University of Oregon (2015), Case Western Reserve University (2017), and Tulane University/Loyola University New Orleans (2018). Given my similar committee experience in the Indiana ACAC, my work on the International ACAC Finance Committee has been key in several areas of transition. Fulfilling the mandate from the Board to open up sponsorship opportunities to more supporters of International ACAC while respecting long-time investors was a primary responsibility as Sponsors Sub-committee Chair in 2017-2018. Our wonderful growth as an organization has fostered a growing number of supporters, and it is a wonderful challenge to highlight those growing relationships. As Sponsorship Sub-committee Chair, seeing the significant increase in the amount of funds raised through sponsorship of the 2018 Conference in New Orleans was especially rewarding given how the financial health of the Association is allowing for funded initiatives, especially those surrounding diversity, to move from conversation and discussion to demonstrated action. I am all in on the benefit of international education to the individual and the world at large, and it goes back to when I took a couple years away—in the midst of my college years—to volunteer in St. Petersburg, Russia where, among other things, I taught free conversational classes in English.
