

Number of U.S. Institutions Awarding Financial Aid & Amount of Financial Aid to International Undergraduate Students, 2011/12-2014/15


Total Financial Aid Awarded to International Students (in millions) —Number of U.S. Institutions Awarding Financial Aid







FINANCIAL-AID OPPORTUNITIES AFTER ENROLMENT

- Work on- and off-campus
 - 20 hours/week while courses are in session
 - 40 hours/week during scheduled breaks
- Co-op and internships (work permit required)
- In-program scholarships, awards, prizes
- Emergency non-academic bursaries

Tuition Fit





As a necessary prologue . . .

What do I mean by "fit"?

Intellectual - Can you be challenged?

Social - Can you be supported?

Financial - Can cost limit post-grad options?

Vocational - Can you find direction & purpose?



How do colleges construct aid packages?

Price is dictated by academic merit and financial need

MERIT



Understand the Link between Prestige & Price

- As ranking goes down, merit aid goes up
 - Highly selective schools get many strong students
 - > Less selective schools want more strong students
 - Larger financial aid packages will come from institutions that are willing to pay to attract high ability students





How to find the biggest bang for your buck?

Start with lower ranked schools (e.g. 75-125 in US News)

- Check the school's website for:
 - > Strategic plan that aims to increase international student enrollment
 - > Financial aid awards specifically for international students
 - Student support services focused on international student needs
